
Dear Ladies of the Greenwood District UMW,



Memorial Tribute to Willie Jo Lagroone

The following remarks are shared by Joyce Crouch, current Greenwood District UMW President. They were read by Zella William, Greenwood District UMW Historian & Past President, at the funeral service of Willie Jo Lagroone on Thursday, July 30. Willie Jo went to be with the Lord on July 25.

It is with great sadness that I bring greetings to you all today. I do offer my deepest condolences to the family of Willie Jo Campbell Lagroone. I have many fond memories of Willie Jo, many fun memories, and many hard-working memories in our years serving in United Methodist Women. I have worked alongside Willie Jo for about 27 years in the UMW. Willie Jo was a dear friend who had a love of her work with DSS and a love for God, her church, her family, and especially United Methodist Women.



Here are a few of the many positions that Willie Jo held in the UMW from what I could find in my records:

On the district level, Willie Jo served on Christian Social Involvement (now called Social Action) from about 1990 - 1993.

She served on Social Action in 2004.

She served on Education & Interpretation from 2005 - 2010.

In 2010, she was elected as Greenwood District President and went on to serve in that capacity for a four-year term from 2011 to 2014.

Here is a quote from her President's Report for Greenwood District UMW Annual Meeting in September 2011 – "God has truly blessed the team this past year. Let it be known that your District Team works for you and we will continue to do so with God's help. To all of you, I give thanks to Greenwood District United Methodist Women because they see what needs to be done and are willing to do it. UMW do not expect anything in return. They simply seek to please God. God has showed His favor upon me, the District Team and the Units of this District. May God add His Blessings upon us as we work so that our communities and the world will be a better place for all God's people. To prospective new members, come journey with us – you – will never be the same." Willie Jo Lagroone, President, Greenwood District UMW"

In September 1993, Willie Jo was elected to the Conference UMW as Chairperson of Committee on Nominations. She had already served four years as a member of the Committee on Nominations.

I am sure Willie Jo had more years of service than what is listed above.

Family, rest assured knowing that Willie Jo is resting in the arms of her Heavenly Father and He probably has already put her to work there. Thank God for such a beautiful person.



 6. Use a program on racial justice or human rights from the UMW Program Book.
 7. Participate in a UMW Social Action/Human Rights Mission Study.
 8. Give a Unit report about an experience; i.e. attendance at a music or theatrical performance by
